NATURAL BEAUTY: THE ART OF RUSTIC FURNITURE

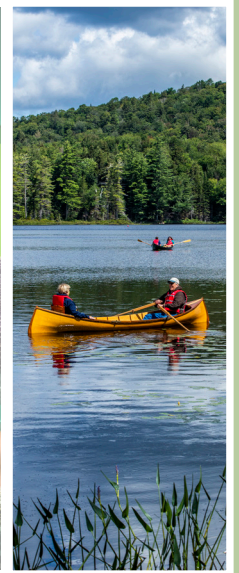

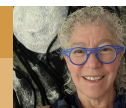

ADKX ARTIST-IN-RESIDENCE THIS MONTH: **JINGHONG CHEN**

Based in Queens, NY, and originally from China, Jinghong Chen is a RISD graduate who explores memory and belonging through the medium of cut paper. Her work blends Chinese folk art with cultural motifs to examine the experiences of migration.

A former RISD Museum Fellow, Chen's intricate, hand-cut designs have been exhibited from New York to Hawaii. Her practice serves as a meditative bridge between past and present, inviting viewers to reconsider the evolving meaning of home and family.

ADKX ARTIST-IN-RESIDENCE THIS MONTH:

JOY MULLER-MCCOOLA

Based in Glens Falls, NY, and an NYU/SUNY Albany graduate, Joy Muller-McCoola uses wet felted wool to explore environmental shifts. Her art is inspired by the water and stone of the Adirondacks, using the migratory history of sheep to mirror human narratives.

After 37 years in art education, Joy now exhibits at venues like the Hudson Valley MOCA. Her work is featured in the touring "Wool & Water" exhibition, highlighting critical ecological issues through the intersection of industrial processes and the natural world.
